

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



BACKGROUND: Ref 1 charges the 902d MIG with the responsibility for field planning and execution of certain types of offensive CE operations,

Ref 2 is an Operational Concept in which an OPLAN outlining actions

submitted for coordination w/FBI-N almost two years ago was not deemed feasible by the latter because of "currently pending operations being conducted" by the FBI.

DISCUSSION: Inst corr aims at the comment that coordination w/FBI-N of operational actions based on a background situation and information similar to that outlined in SOI attached to basic letter proved unsuccessful almost two years ago cannot be considered valid because of the time passed since then and, consequently, the possibility of a change of the circumstances leading to the unsuccessful coordination w/FBI-N at the time.

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

1. On 19 Nov 73, [redacted] was interviewed, at his own request, by representatives of the Fort Meade Field Office, 109th MIG, and reported that he had many friends among [redacted] that he was visiting these seamen aboard ship as well as receiving them as visitors at his home, and that [redacted] casual conversations during these visits, provided the following information, either as first-hand information or as hearsay. (F-6)
2. During a visit to China, a film on the [redacted] shown to [redacted] showed a Soviet officer standing on a hill at the bottom of which stood approximately [redacted] who fell dead when the officer dropped his hand. A laser beam, according to the seamen, was used as the execution instrument. (F-6)
3. [redacted] docking in China are usually welcomed by Chinese people, the seamen being treated "royally", being given all the food and fruit they can eat, invited to the best theaters and restaurants, and frequently also invited into private homes. Soviet ships docking in the same ports and their crews are completely ignored. (F-6)
4. Some of [redacted] during a tour of a so-called Chinese cultural center, saw maps showing China and [redacted] with the USSR blanked out and [redacted] in possession of its territory. (F-6)
5. There have been fights between [redacted] and Soviet seamen in various ports, e.g. in New York and in West Germany. (F-6)
6. [redacted] heard [redacted] complain about the quality of Soviet navigational equipment, which, they say, is unreliable and frequently breaks down. (F-6)

4. REPORT OF FINDINGS

(MISCELLANEOUS) On 19 November 1973, [redacted] was interviewed, at his own request, at his place of business. [redacted] stated as follows:

[redacted] related that he had many [redacted] during the times [redacted] were in port [redacted] visited them aboard ship and became acquainted with many seamen and ship officers. During the past several weeks, while visiting [redacted] home, various seamen began talking about some of their experiences in other countries. The following information was related to [redacted] through casual conversation with [redacted] either as first hand information or as hearsay:

On one visit to China. [redacted] are shown film accounts of the [redacted]. The film showed a Soviet officer standing on a hill with his hand raised. At the bottom of the hill stood approximately [redacted]. When the officer dropped his hand, the people at the bottom of the hill fell dead. The seaman relating this information stated that a laser had been used for the mass murder.

[redacted] destined for China are usually welcomed at the docks by Chinese nationals. The seamen are given the royal treatment; given all the food and fruit they can eat; are taken to all the best theaters and restaurants; and are frequently invited into the private homes of Chinese nationals. Notwithstanding, the Soviet ships at the same port, at the same time, are totally ignored. No hospitality is extended toward them by the "people" of China.

During a tour of one of the Chinese cultural centers by some of the seamen, maps were noted, on which China and [redacted] and the Soviet Union was merely blanked out. These same maps also indicated [redacted] in possession of the territory now occupied by the Soviet Union.

Several clashes broke out between [redacted] Soviet seamen at various ports around the world. In one instance, in a New York harbor, fighting broke out among [redacted] Soviet seamen. What was reportedly a racial outbreak occurred in a nightclub in a port city in West Germany.

On his visits aboard [redacted] recalled hearing seamen and officers complaining about the poor Soviet navigational equipment aboard ship. They complain that it is unreliable, and frequently breaks down.


